An Ocean County assemblyman, two Monmouth County rabbis and a Lakewood housing official were among the 44 people charged Thursday in a charged Thursday in a sweeping federal probe into political corruption, international money laundering and the trafficking of human kidneys.

The raid that targeted Ocean, Monmouth and Hudson counties, as well as Brooklyn, N.Y., ensnared two distinct groups; public

two distinct groups: public officials accused of extorting thousands of dollars in bribes, and rabbis accused of using Jewish charities they controlled to launder millions of dollars.

"The arrests underscore more than ever the pervasive nature of corruption in the state," acting U.S. Attorney Ralph J. Marra Jr. said. "Corruption was a way of life" for the public officials. "They existed in an ethics-free zone."

As for the accused religious leaders, Marra said the rabbis acted as "crime bosses." They typically charged a fee of 5 to 10 percent for each money-laundering transaction, Marra

"New Jersey's corruption problem is one of the worst, if not the worst, in the na-tion," said Ed Kahrer, who heads the FBI's white-collar and public corruption investigation division. "Corvestigation division. ruption is a cancer that is destroying the core values of this state."
