

Ex-cop denies sex in school

But pleads guilty to burglary count

TOMS RIVER — A retired state trooper denied in court that he had a sexual rendezvous at Toms River Intermediate East middle school with his ex-girlfriend, a teacher — contradicting statements by his own lawyer that he had done so.

Bruce A. Figular, 50, of Toms
River, made the statement as he
pleaded guilty Thursday in
Ocean County Superior Court to
one count of third-degree burglary before Judge Francis
Hodgson Jr. in connection with
entering Toms River Intermediate East and accusations of having sexual contact with a teacher
in the school in January, said Al
Della Fave, spokesman cf the
Ocean County Prosecutor's Office.

Robert Fuggi, Figular's attorney, stated in May that his client had multiple romantic encounters inside of the Toms River middle school. The woman's attorney, Bradley Billhimer, at the time called the claims "100 percent false."

"We are happy with the conclusion of this case," Billhimer said Friday. "The most important thing is that the truth came out and that Mr. Figular has finally
